NON PHARMACOLOGIC MEASURES

 Nasal irrigation and allergen avoidance (e.g., keeping windows closed, using window screen filters and air conditioning, limiting outdoor time during peak allergen season, showering after outdoor exposure)

OVER-THE-COUNTER PHARMACOLOGIC MEASURES

FIRST LINE Recommendations

Nasal corticosteroids (Flonase, Nasacort, Nasonex, Rhinocort)

- For moderate to severe, persistent symptoms (nasal congestion, itchy, irritated, or watery eyes)
- May get some relief a few hours after the first dose but it can take at least 2 weeks for max improvement

Oral antihistamines (Allegra, Claritin, Xyzal, Zyrtec)

- For mild or intermittent symptoms (itching, sneezing, runny nose)
- Can be used as needed (effects start in about an hour)
- Caution use in elderly and people with severe liver impairment
- Avoid drinking fruit juices with Allegra
- Zyrtec more likely to cause drowsiness

ADD-ON therapy if needed

Nasal antihistamines (Astepro)

- Add-on therapy with nasal steroids if needed for nasal congestion Ophthalmic antihistamines (Alaway, Pataday)
- Add-on therapy with nasal steroids if needed for eye symptoms
 Decongestants (Sudafed, Afrin)
- Use for inadequate response from a nasal steroid for nasal congestion
- Caution use in hypertension, coronary heart disease, glaucoma, diabetes, hyperthyroidism, MAOI use
- Do not use intranasal decongestant for more than 3-5 days
